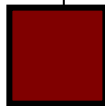

What is a P&C Association?

- ❖ The P&C was established under the *School Education Act 1999* for the purpose of supporting a government school system for the benefit of all children.
- ❖ A P&C comprises of the parents and guardians of the children attending the school and interested community members.

What are the functions?

- ❖ Encourage parents to participate in the developing of the school's educational policy.
- ❖ Help develop parent participation and involvement in the school.
- ❖ Be a forum for the parents to discuss issues pertaining to the school and its community and for gathering opinions.
- ❖ Promote and support communication and cooperation within the school community.

Meeting Times:

Meetings are held twice a term usually around weeks 2 and 6 in the school Library. We try and accommodate as many members as possible so the day and time may vary. Notices are always sent home with students when meetings are being held.

Canteen:

Our school Canteen is open on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Students are able to order their lunches on these days as well as purchase healthy & delicious snacks at recess.

The P&C Fundraising:

Parents are encouraged to pay a yearly P&C Voluntary Donation of \$20.00 per child or \$50.00 per family. This donation is payable at the office and EFTPOS is available.

This donation in conjunction with other fundraising events throughout the year will be used by the P&C to provide additional resources to the school to improve and enhance the educational opportunities available to our children. All funds must be used for the benefit of all students that are attending the school.
